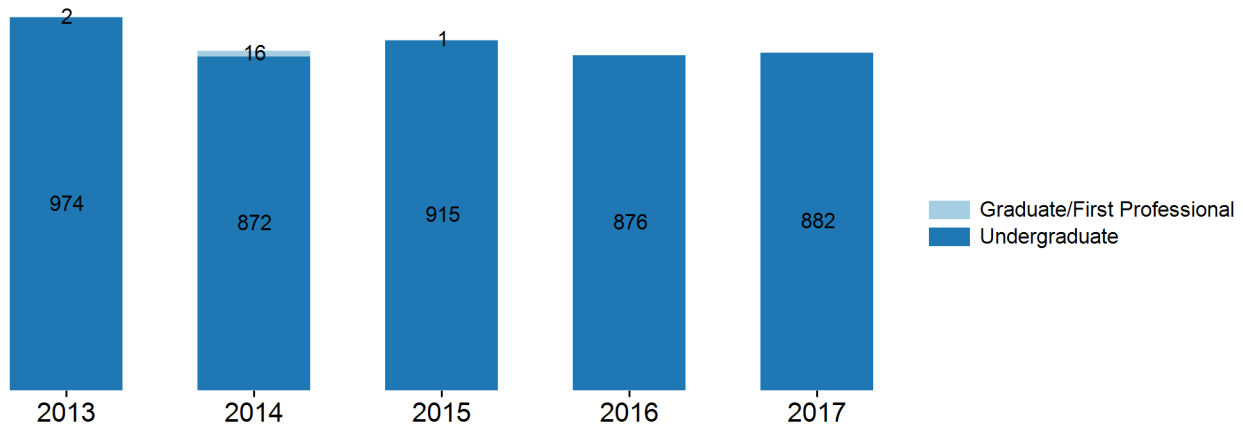

Spring Headcount Enrollment - Five-Year Trend



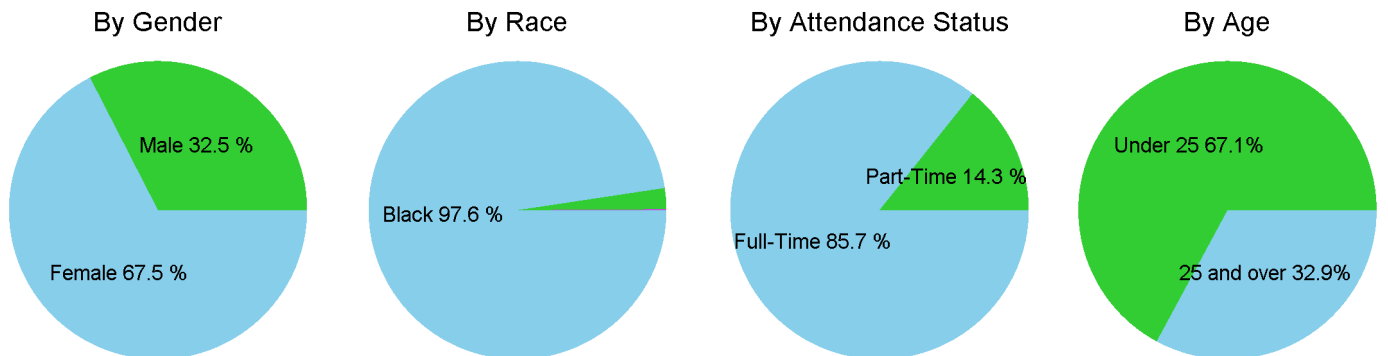

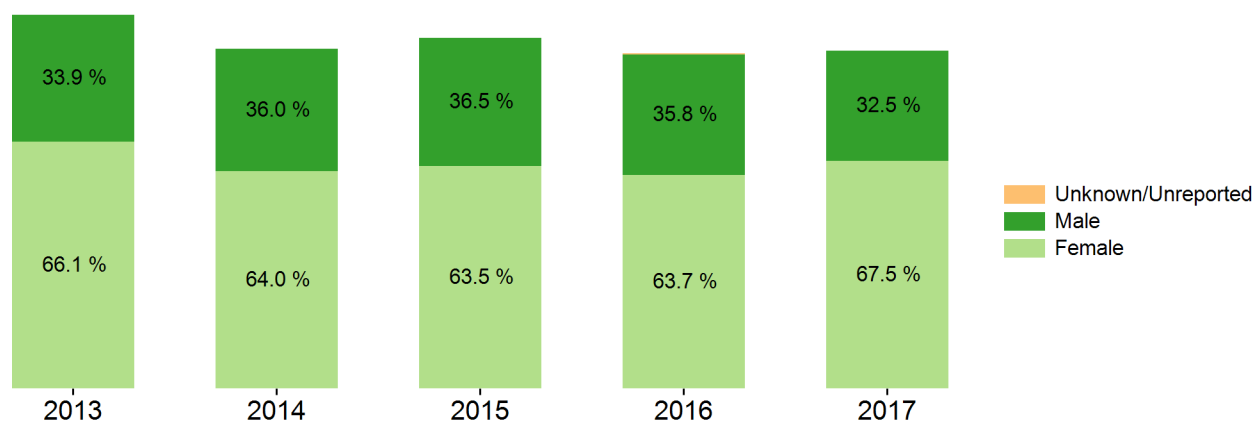

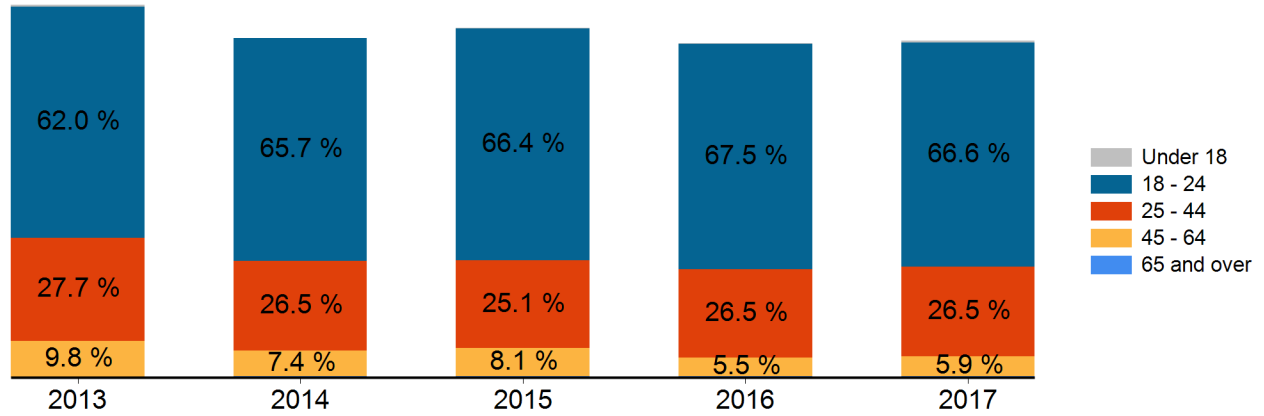

Spring Headcount by Gender - Five-Year Trend



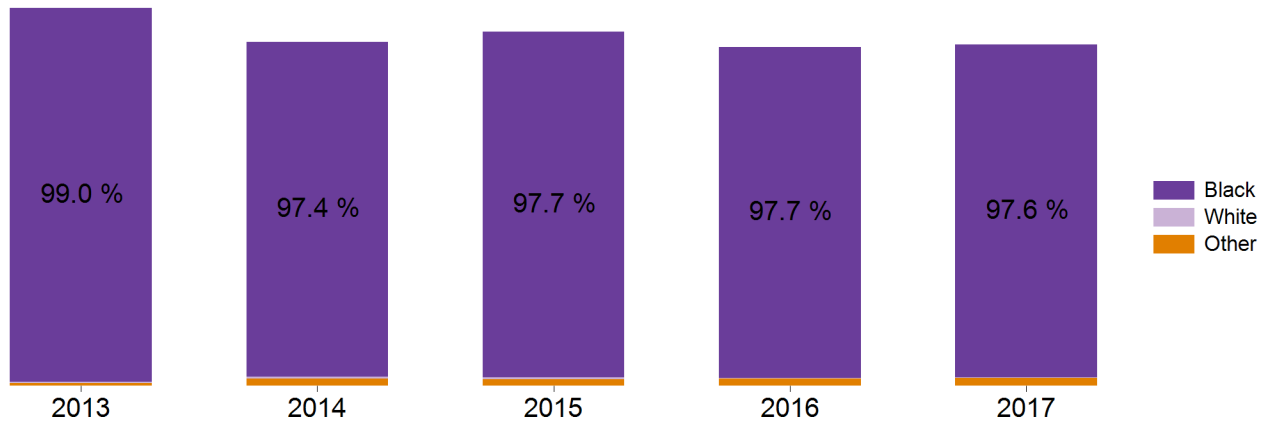

Spring Headcount by Race/Ethnicity - Five-Year Trend

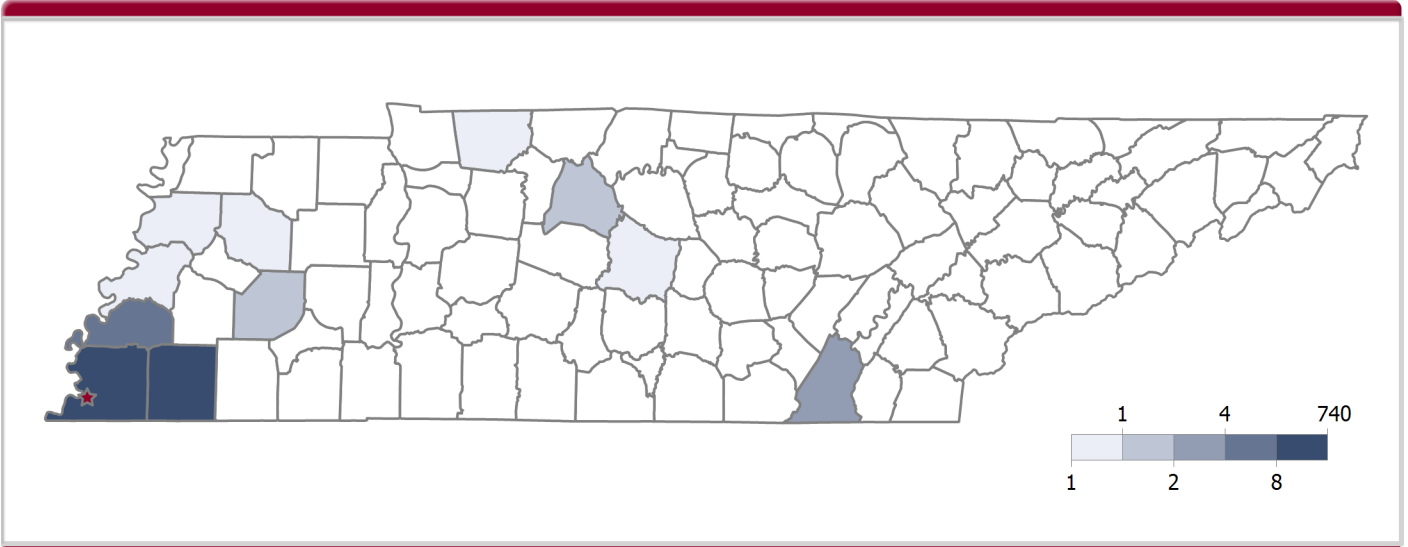

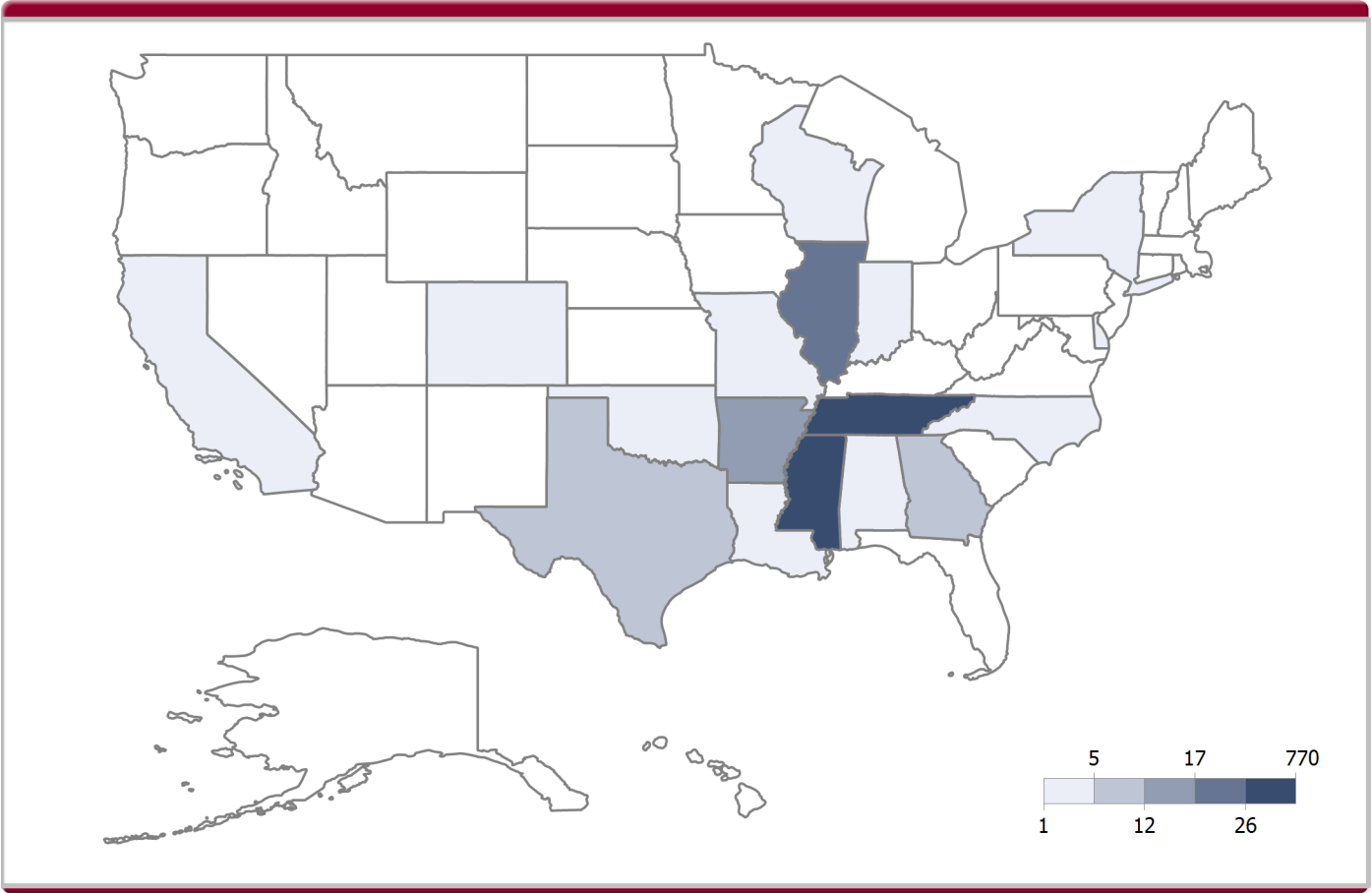
